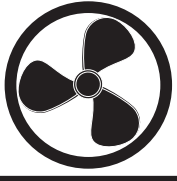

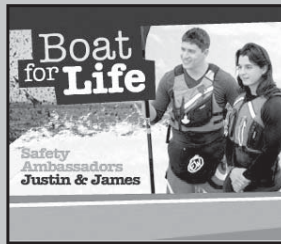

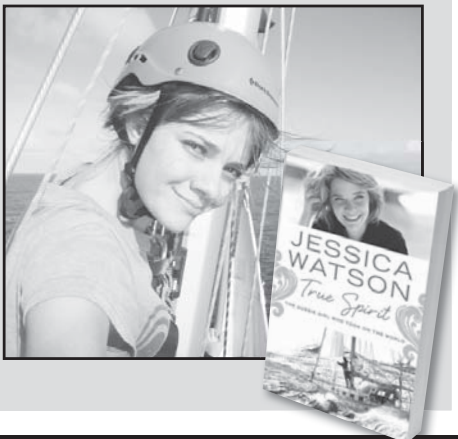

## Jessica Watson

Jessica Watson, 'the darling of the high seas' will appear daily at the Better Boating Lounge in Hall 2 to tell the story of her amazing voyage and new book 'True Spirit'.

Jessica captured people's imagination in her determination and commitment to be the youngest person to sail solo, non-stop and unassisted around the world.

On the 15 May 2010, after 210 days at sea and 24,000 nautical miles, Jessica sailed through the heads to an enthusiastic welcome having achieved what she set out to do.



## Don McIntyre



April 28, 2010 marked the 221st anniversary of the Mutiny on the Bounty, where Fletcher Christian cast William Bligh and 18 of his men adrift in a 23ft boat, beginning one of the greatest open boat voyages in maritime history. During the following seven weeks, Bligh and his men sailed over 3,700 nautical miles, in an overloaded boat, with little food or water and no charts, from Tonga to Kupang in Timor.

Australian adventurer, Don McIntyre and three crew relived Bligh's nightmare by sailing the same voyage in an 18th century traditional open timber whale boat.

Don will be onstage at the Better Boating Lounge in Hall 2 with two of his crew to tell their amazing story.

### Ella's Pink Lady

Jessica Watson's adventure was aboard an S&S 34, a classic design from the famous Sparkman & Stephens and well known for its

seaworthiness, toughness and track record. It is a boat capable of consistent speeds and one that Jessica could easily handle. The S&S 34 became famous after Jon Sanders, David Dicks and Jesse Martin used them for their history-making solo circumnavigations. Jessica will be appearing daily on the Better Boating Lounge (Hall 2 - stand 228).
