



**OUTER REEF YACHTS ANNOUNCES NEW 65 YACHTFISH AT
2009 SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL BOAT SHOW**

As an expansion of the just released Yachtfish line, Outer Reef Yachts is announcing the 65 Yachtfish at the 2009 Sydney International Boat Show. Based on the highly successful Outer Reef 63 Raised Pilothouse Motor Yacht, the 65 Yachtfish sports a 7' cockpit and all the related fishing gear as fitted to the larger 86 Yachtfish. This new model will be built from a lengthened mold of the Outer Reef 63, enhancing hull performance over the existing 63 due to the additional waterline length. Standard engine specifications will see twin 503hp Caterpillar C-9 engines, with other options available to owners.

Many boat owners and their families that do not fish hardcore any longer, but who still wish to drag bait, are looking in a different direction - that of the Yachtfish Motor Yacht, as the Yachtfisher design delivers the best of both worlds. Owners can enjoy their passion for fishing from the designated fishing cockpit with fighting chair, rod holders, game poles, live bait tanks and tackle station - while family and guests can relax on the alfresco deck leading to the salon, or on the extended flybridge that is the largest in its class.

If you are looking to fish in far-off destinations, the Yachtfish platform affords longer range and comfort, and your family and guests can truly relax whilst offshore on extended fishing adventures. Another great benefit is avoiding all those fueling stops along the way, as with the traditional battlewagon.

The Outer Reef Long Range Motor Yacht is a natural for transition to the Yachtfish platform due to her inherent stability, offshore capabilities (open Ocean "A" rating, meaning 18-20' seas, with sustained 40 knots plus winds), copious storage and deck space. With the huge boat deck of the 86 Yachtfish, the owner's favourite flats boat can be stored onboard rather than towing it. As well, with her proven semi-displacement hull design, desired speeds can be attained by owners choosing an engine package based on their cruising/fishing requirements.

Although getting to the fishing grounds may take a bit longer at 14-18 knots rather than 35 knots, once you get there, you can raise fish just like you did on that hardcore battlewagon. After a day of hauling in the dinner, you and your family can relax aboard in opulent luxury with all the accoutrements that a fine Motor Yacht affords its owners.

“Being a custom builder we can customize any Outer Reef from 58’ to 115’ to the owner’s specifications. We see the Yachtfish market as one that will continue to expand over the coming years and we will be introducing many more models into our Yachtfish fleet”, says Jeff Drucek, CEO and designer of Outer Reef Yachts.
